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The Flower Show was an improvement over last year with the flower arranging class exhibiting their floral arts. We held the Brass Band concert in April instead of the usual Christmas event and it was better attended. We will continue to use this date for future concerts.

The Senior Citizens' Christmas Party was held in December when 88 people sat down to a traditional Christmas Dinner. The school choir did their usual performance but there was no other additional entertainment due to unfortunate circumstances. We had £200 left from the Asda funding of last year which helped mitigate some of the costs.

The replacement of the asbestos roof on the industrial unit had its own problems which meant an extended period of work together with increased costs. This was to comply with current fire regulations. The work started in August just when the rains came. That in itself causes more problems as the contractors sheeting did not manage to stop water ingress into our existing store. We are now more or less back to normal and at least we are a completely asbestos free site.
